

COUNTY COUNCILLORS REPORT - JANUARY 2016

COSMESTON AND PORTHKERRY COUNTRY PARKS

The Vale of Glamorgan Council is exploring opportunities for opening Cosmeston and Porthkerry Country Parks up to a range of new leisure activities, as part of a plan due to be considered by the authority's Cabinet in January. The Cabinet is discussing options this week. The object is to generate additional income.

The Vale plans to invite tenders to develop tourism and commercial opportunities at both country parks and the Cosmeston Medieval Village. Cabinet says that 'It is anticipated that this could see the sites soon offering a range of outdoor pursuits, tourism events, weddings, and fayres and water based leisure activities.'

BRYNEITHIN

Planning permission was granted subject to conditions relating a range of issues including the traffic management adjacent to St Andrews Road.

CAERLEON ROAD – PLANNING APPLICATION – 70 HOUSES

The application for 70 houses will be considered on Thursday 14th February. The access will be via Castle Drive. The planning report states concerning traffic:

"It is therefore considered that the impact of the proposed development could be mitigated to an acceptable degree without significantly increasing delays to existing road users. Mitigation in the form of the implementation of an effective Travel Plan that is complemented by measures to enhance both pedestrian movement and the site's connectivity to Eastbrook Railway Station will reduce the proposed development's vehicular trip generation."

PENYTURNPIKE ROAD - RESURFACING

The road in the vicinity of the Ardwyn development is scheduled to be resurfaced this week.
